The Playwright

Lael Louisiana Timberlake Wertenbaker was born in the United States. Her father, Charles Wertenbaker, was a foreign correspondent for Time magazine. She attended college in the U.S., graduating from St. John's College in 1966, and soon after, she began working as a writer for Time-Life Books. Later, she taught French in Greece, and by 1970, she had moved to London where she became involved with a number of different small theatre companies and turned to playwrighting. She earned the praise of London critics for a number of outstanding plays, which were produced throughout the 1980's. She has received numerous awards including the Most Promising Playwright Award in 1985 for The Grace of Mary Traverse, the Laurence Olivier Play of the Year Award and the Evening Standard Play of the Year Award in 1988 for Our Country's Good, and the Eileen Anderson Central Television Drama Award in 1989 for The Love of the Nightingale.
