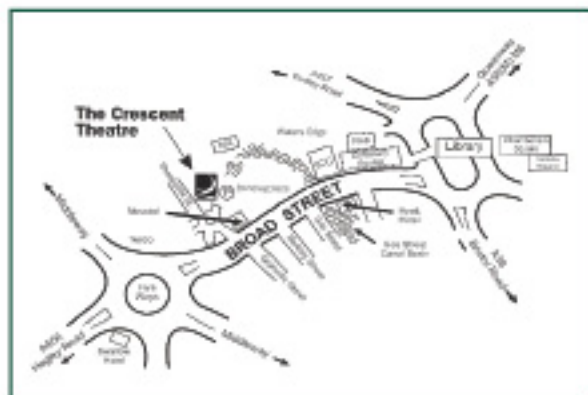

How To Get There

The Crescent Theatre is situated just off Broad Street in the heart of the Brindleyplace development.

By car: Turn into Sheepcote Street at the traffic light junction by the Novotel, then follow the signposts for the Brindleyplace Car Park. Tickets can be purchased from the Crescent Theatre Box Office when buying show tickets.

By public transport: New Street and Snow Hill stations are about 15 minutes walk away, whilst Five Ways station on the Cross City Line is just 10 minutes away. The majority of buses run along Broad Street at regular intervals. Taxis can drop passengers by the front entrance on Sheepcote Street.
